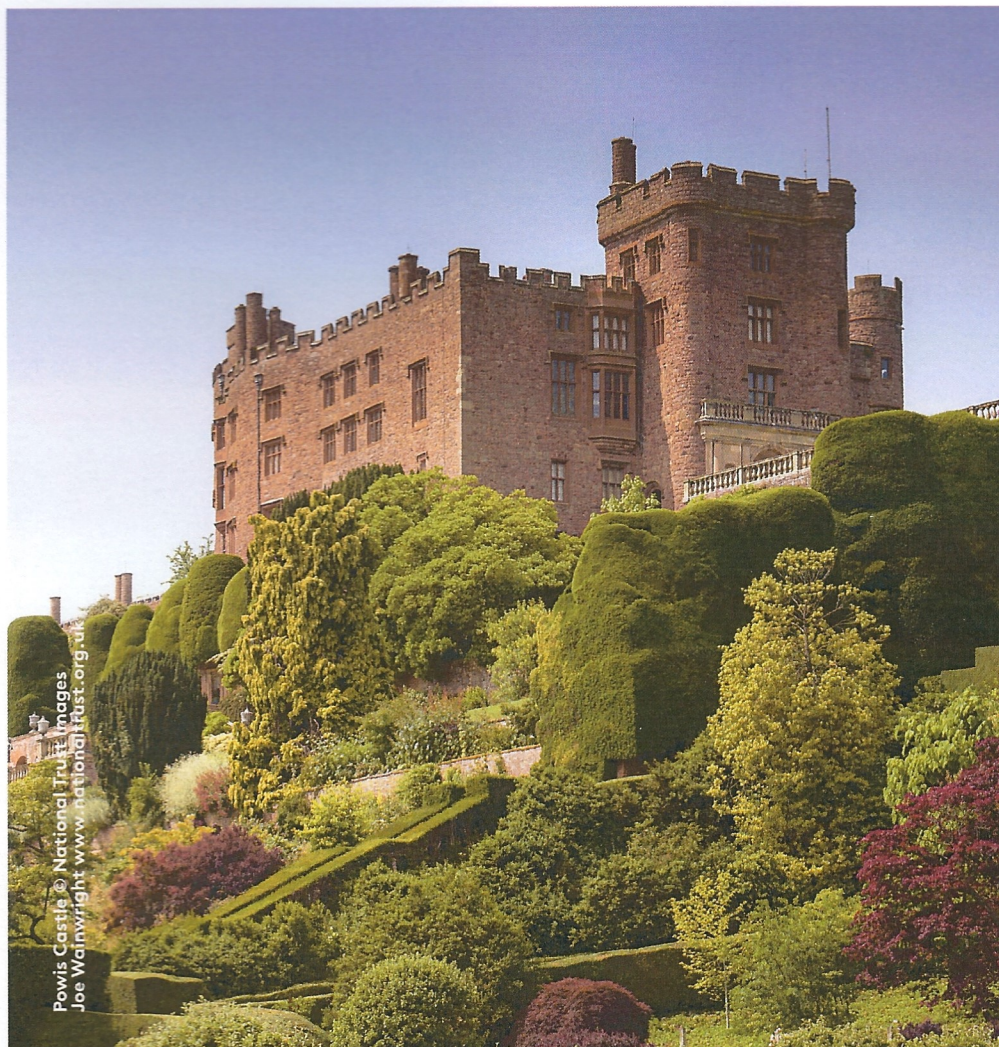


Gardens of North Wales

Horticultural highlights include Portmeirion, Plas Newydd, the Hidden Gardens of Plas Cadnant, Bodnant Garden and a few lesser-known gems and some time to enjoy the spectacular scenery.

Powis Castle and Gardens (NT)

Discover the magnificent collection of artwork, tapestries and furniture in this redbrick 13th century castle. As well as hosting some of Wales' finest paintings, you'll find exotic treasures from India and the Far East. The beautiful Italian and French influenced gardens are overflowing with rare plants and sculptures. Enjoy a peaceful walk through the Edwardian formal garden with century-old apple trees, rose beds and a woodland area.

Plas Cadnant Hidden Gardens

Restoration of the historic Plas Cadnant Estate began in 1996, and today large parts of the gardens have undergone a spectacular restoration to their former glory. Three different gardens have been discovered, including an unusual walled garden with curving walls and pool, a secret valley garden with three waterfalls and river, and an upper woodland garden with stone outcrops and the remains of a 19c. folly. Now a new garden is being created, making this gem a true plantsman's paradise.

Portmeirion

The iconic Italianate architecture, designed by Welsh architect Sir Clough Williams-Ellis in the early 20th century, makes this an intriguing place to visit. The colourful collection of buildings is fringed with wondrous ornamental gardens, giving this village a subtropical feel. There's also a great range of shops, restaurants and cafés, so you won't be short of shopping opportunities and a bite to eat.

Conwy

This compact town is home to Quay House – the smallest house in Britain! But don't let the size fool you, as there's plenty to see and do. As well as an ancient castle to look around, there's Plas Mawr – a splendid 16th century town house – on the high street, and a picturesque quay and marina to relax in whilst soaking up some superb views.

Plas Brondanw House & Garden

Located within the spectacular Snowdonia National Park, this was the private home of the Arts and Crafts architect, Clough Williams Ellis and his wife from 1902-1978. The unique and distinctive grade I listed gardens were inspired by Italian renaissance styled gardens with features such as stone walls, topiary, fountains and avenues of trees backed by the dramatic mountain landscape of the National Park. The woodland walk takes visitors to a picturesque folly tower built in 1915 with incredible surrounding views.

Plas Newydd (NT)

This National Trust property sits on the Menai Strait's coastline. The historic mansion contains the largest exhibition of Rex Whistler's works, and you'll find a unique artefacts from the Battle of Waterloo in the military museum. With a woodland walk, Australasian arboretum and Italian-style terrace, you're spoilt for choice with beautiful flora to enjoy.

Bodnant Garden (NT)

This Grade 1-listed National Trust garden is home to national collections of plants and champion trees, many of which are over 150 years old. The grand terraces, sweeping lawns and sublime year-round beauty of the gardens makes this a horticulturalist's dream. With the dramatic views of Snowdonia and the Carneddau Mountains serving as a backdrop this really is a must-see attraction..

Goldstone Hall Gardens

Set in the grounds of a country house hotel, the quintessential English Garden combines both formal and informal planting and is set over 5 acres overlooking beautiful countryside. There's the Wildflower Garden & Arches and the Terrace & Rose Walk with a mix of beautiful old varieties. Stroll through the Walled Garden with its fragrant herbaceous borders and marvel at the Kitchen Garden with 100 different herbs and garden varieties.

Celtic Royal Hotel, Caernarfon

Steeped in tradition and royal history, the Celtic Royal Hotel is located just a 10-minute walk from Caernarfon's walled old town with the stunning landscapes of North Wales close by. Stylish en-suite guest rooms are well appointed with a TV, hairdryer and tea/coffee making facilities. Hotel facilities include a relaxing lounge with comfy seating, the atmospheric Castell Restaurant and Y Copa Bar as well as a recently refurbished indoor swimming pool and spa.

Tick to confirm you have appropriate travel insurance if requested - it's not compulsory on UK coach tours but it is recommended.

If you have not arranged insurance yet that's OK, but by ticking this you are accepting that you will arrange appropriate travel insurance. It is always advisable to arrange travel insurance as soon as you book. We do not need the specific details of your insurance

Click Book and then the Confirm Booking if it's all correct.

You'll be taken to the card payment screen.

When paying by card, your bank may have extra security measures in place and wish to send you a one-time passcode or ask you to approve the payment by banking app.

Once the deposit has been paid, you should receive two emails. One contains your booking confirmation and the second is a payment receipt. If they don't appear in your inbox, please check your junk / spam folders.

Balance reminders will be sent automatically two weeks prior to the balance due date.
